



DPV Health's Healthy Mothers Healthy Babies program supports pregnant women in Hume and Whittlesea and is managed by an experienced team of social workers and midwives.

The program supports pregnant women who have complex needs or greater health risks because of factors such as pregnancy concerns, disability, mental health issues, family violence, drug, or alcohol issues, or who are Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander or are from a culturally and linguistically diverse background.

We offer home visits as well as clinic-based and telehealth appointments and help you to create tailored plan and work alongside you to meet your needs and goals. We deliver health promotion messages to support healthy behaviors and also assist you to access other health and community services during and after pregnancy.

Circle of Security Parenting Program

Circle of Security at DPV Health is a FREE 8-week parenting program for mothers who want to strengthen their relationship with their children aged 4 months to 6 years.

It is an evidence-based parenting program developed from attachment theory and targeted to parents of children aged 4 months to 6 years. The program is delivered by Healthy Mothers Healthy Babies social workers and midwives who are certified facilitators.



We will help you to

- > Recognise and respond to your child's needs.
- > Understand your child's behaviour.
- > Recognise that all parents struggle at times and there is no such thing as a 'perfect parent'.
- > Begin to understand your own reactions to your child.

Who can use this service

The service is available to pregnant women.

Referrals or self-referrals should be made prior to 34 weeks gestation.

It is available to women who live in the Cities of Hume and Whittlesea.

Fees

This service is FREE. No Medicare Card or Health Care Card is required.

Access to Interpreter Services

We offer FREE interpreter access to all clients who need it.

If you require an interpreter, please let our staff know at the time of making an appointment.
